Volunteer Role Title: Sound Team Leader

Preparation time required for this role: Training (1hour) and ongoing if needed

Frequency: as per rota, but ideally once or maybe twice a month

General Role Description:

In addition to the general 'Sound Operator' requirements, the Sound Team Leader will also:

- Communicate and work well with the Band Leader
- Lead a team of volunteers
- Treat volunteers with respect and dignity, helping them to develop their sound engineering skills as well as supporting their spiritual growth
- Train and support volunteers in their team equipping them with the skills needed for the role
- Work towards a situation where the volunteer no longer needs the assistance of the team leader to carry out their role well
- Keep an inventory of the sound equipment
- Inform Overseers when additional sound equipment is purchased for insurance purposes
- Keep PAT testing of equipment up to date (arrange for testing to take place)

- Help volunteers in their team to implement the church Health and Safety Policy and risk assessments, giving gentle reminders where necessary
- Work in conjunction with the Band Leader to manage a budget
- To purchase any new equipment needed
- To dispose of / sell on any equipment no longer needed (for church funds)
- To be able to sort out any rota replacements for their team as and when the need arises
- Complete safeguarding and health and safety training once a year. If you cannot attend the date given this can be conducted virtually at home at your convenience.
- Be aware of The King's Church, Wisbech's health and safety policy and implement it.
- Be aware that safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. If you see or hear anything that concerns you whether it be regarding a vulnerable person or not, you must notify a leader preferably using a 'logging a concern' form which can be found in the church cupboard or on the church website.
