Free Things to do in Wisbech with your kids this summer

5 Regular Activities

- Wisbech Park
- A great place for kids to run around in the 12 acres of green space. Playground with a good variety of newly updated equipment, tennis courts and a basketball area. There is also a café and toilets nearby.
- Splash Pad

Another amenity in Wisbech Park, next to the playground, but our kids love it so much it deserved it's own mention in our guide. Kids will have fun getting wet - so come prepared!

- Peckover House Gardens

- Wisbech Library

Rose Fair: Saturday 28th June 2025

There is always a buzz around town when Rose Fair is happening. Lots of things to see and do in and around the Town Centre and St Peter's Church Gardens. There is also a walking parade that leaves from St Peter's Car Park and moves through the Market Place and ends by the War Memorial. This happens twice, at 11am and again at 2pm. An event not to be missed.

WisBEACH Rock Festival: Sunday 3rd August 2025

This is a very child-friendly music festival that is free for the community. Starting around 11am and finishing at 8pm, it takes places in Wisbech Park and hosts a wide variety of musical styles and performances (not just rock!). There are funfair rides (which you need to pay for - although some are free so do ask) donkey rides, mini golf and a huge 'beach' (sandpit). Lots of food and drinks vans and at least 2 music stages.
