A list of allergies is requested when children are registered for King's Youth. If any are specified the volunteer team should be informed and reminded periodically. 	If any children are displaying signs of an allergic reaction, then the designated First Aider and parents should be sought as soon as possible. An accident form completed.
Manual Handling		 See General Risk Assessment. No children should be taking part in manual handling unless under direct supervision from a volunteer. Children should not be given any manual handling which is beyond their capabilities. 	
Outings	The staff, volunteers and children in attendance.	 Separate Risk Assessments will be written for any King's Youth outings. Staff/volunteers in attendance must read these prior to the event.
